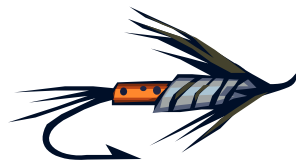

On Sunday the 12th of October, the club was invited to attend the Maiden Gully Community Festival to promote the club. Thanks to Steve and Tom Charles, Jeff Willey, Al Chisholm, Al Choat and Tony Jacobs for attending and putting on fly tying demonstrations and assisting attendees with casting.

On the 18th and 19th of October, 6 members headed to Creswick to represent the Club in the Wastell Shield. Steve and I went and tried Hepburn on the Friday with Steve landing a little stocky and poor angling by myself resulted in a dropped fish which took a stick caddis. On the way to the caravan park to meet up with others and register we went via Deans Res. Once again poor angling by myself I missed the rise on my Adams as I was looking around admiring what a nice res it is. For me that was as much of enticing the fish I was going to have for the weekend.

On the Saturday Al Chisholm picked up a nice brown to 850gms. I believe Jeff Willey landed a smaller one at Wendouree. A total of 12 fish were weighed in with the winner being Geoff Lay from Peninsula FFC with a very nice brown of 2.7 kg from Tullaroop. Interesting is that the next largest was a 2.46kg fish also from Tullaroop. I called in there on the way home on Sunday and I couldn't get over how many midge were on the wing and on the surface. It is also worth noting that the surface was just littered with insects, beetles and the like. Plenty of feed around will only see the trout get bigger.

Casting Encounters.

Back in August club members Joe Singe, Col Holland, Bob Evans, John Goulden and I spent just 5 days at Turangi New Zealand chasing the Rainbows that run up the rivers from Lake Taupo; it was amusing to me to hear the different reasons from other anglers, some locals, why they thought the Rainbows had not yet moved into the rivers. Very strange as we caught some twenty seven up to 4 ½ lb. in 3 days of fishing.

The water is too cold at the moment.

The hens are still back in the lake

The water is too high at the moment.

We are waiting for a new flush.

The levels have to drop a lot more.

Only the bucks are in the river at the moment.

It will be another two weeks.

All the hens are at the river mouth.

The water has to clear a lot more.

They have not moved into the pools yet.

Fishing Report

Remember, folks, if we don't collect the data on how our local fisheries are performing then we won't have a voice in trying to improve them. Between club outings, Wastell Shield, club championships and casual fishing trips, there were plenty of members who hit the water in the last month. You know how many reports came in? **None.**

If reporting by email doesn't work for you, let myself or another committee member know what would be better. Help us to make it as easy as possible to gather this important info!

Newlyn

Water levels are very high and very clear. I've had reports of dun hatches on good days and trout seen smelting and jumping after dragonflies. The NE corner has been performing well and a couple of good fish were taken from Newlyn during the Wastell Shield

Hepburn Lagoon

Hepburn is also very full and clear and in the right conditions is fishing very well! The calm water has loads of dragons and damsels and clouds of orange spinners, and the little trout at least have been feeding on the surface. I caught a small brown on an Adams pattern on



our warm-up for the Wastell. Al Chisholm was the only club member to get one on the board for the Wastell with a beautiful 852 gm brown, and he caught it on a slowly retrieved Neon Damsel wet. Other success at Hepburn has been on Stick Caddis, Brown Nymphs and an early morning Mudeye pattern. Duns can be seen hatching through the middle of the day and the trout are starting to look upwards for a feed as things warm up.

Dean Res

Dean is looking great with high water levels, deep drop-offs and excellent visibility. We fished here for the Wastell and saw fish on the move but didn't have any luck.

Barkers Creek Res

Water levels are steadily rising at Barkers and there are plenty of fish on the move. How many of them are trout is difficult to determine as the water is still somewhat murky and the feeding has been largely sub-surface. The vast majority of heads I've seen poking out of the water have been of the carp variety. The Reddies have been fishing well with lure and bait fishermen catching good size specimens and we even saw a rare double hook-up a few weeks back. I caught three Reddies last Sunday morning on an LPS pattern and all of them had smelt in their bellies.

Lauriston Res

Reportedly quite low at the moment but I haven't verified that in the last month. I'd encourage all club members to have a go at the Midlands Shield at Lauriston on the 9th Nov.

Tullaroop

Tullaroop is looking fantastic with good water levels and clarity. The best fish of the Wastell were caught here with 2.7 kg and 2.4 kg browns weighed in.

Rivers

The Goulburn has been running extremely high with releases of up to 10,000 MLD!! For those willing to put in the time the backwaters and edges around Thornton are performing well but the safer option is now the Rubicon which is flowing at a more comfortable level. I've also heard good reports from the Steavenson between Marysville and Buxton with a dozen fish caught in one afternoon between two anglers.
