#### **Goldfields Shield Report**

Disappointingly, only four Bendigo Club members participated in the Goldfields Shield competition at Lake Wendouree on the weekend of the 21/22 April. Not to be deterred, the four members set about trying to wrest the "Hubcap" from the Ballarat Club.

Tony, Al and I arrived on Friday afternoon to check out the conditions. I was able to observe that a lot of the high weed had been cut since the 2 Fly competition last month. With the sunny skies and the absence of any wind, Tony stated that he thought we may have made a wrong turn somewhere as this weather was not normal for Ballarat. Greg arrived early evening.

We stayed at the Windmill Caravan Park again and dined at the Ballarat Golf Club on Friday night after enjoying a drink during the happy hour with Ballarat club members at their clubrooms.

We were on the water and fishing by 0730hrs on Saturday morning. Tony and Al were in Al's boat, Greg fished with Doug Kimberley from Ballarat and I fished with Steve Lock from Ballarat. The morning session was a blank except for some good sized reddies being landed. The clear skies and not a breath of wind during the morning were not the ideal weather conditions conducive to fly fishing for trout. About 1400 hrs the cloud cover arrived being pushed along by a medium breeze. Competitors started to land trout with the change and by 1700hrs most anglers returned to report their success or otherwise. Alan Townshend had a great sessions landing three good size brown trout the largest being 57cm, which ended up as the winner of the Goldfields Shield.

Sunday morning was "groundhog day" again with clear skies and no wind. Tony and Al fished together again, Greg fished from his boat and I fished with Jeff Baldock from the Ballarat Club. Al managed to get on the board with a nice rainbow, but other than a number of takes by competitors and dropping one myself, it was not a fruitful session.

In all there were 19 fish landed by 12 anglers. There were a couple of reported long distance releases (including one by myself) and some takes which failed to connect. There were 15 browns and four rainbows caught. This was a better return than last year when there were no fish landed by anyone at Lake Fyans. The biggest from our members was caught by myself measuring 475mm and weighing 1150gm. As the Goldfields Shield competition counts towards our Club Championship, this fish leads the competition. Members now have only two weekends to catch a heavier trout to claim the title.

In summary, other than the weather conditions on both Saturday and Sunday mornings, it was a successful trip and it was great to mix with the members of the Ballarat Club. The challenge for our Club members is to regroup and start planning to wrest the 'Hubcap' from Ballarat next year.
